

WHAT COSTS IMPACT ASSET LIFECYCLE COSTS?



Why is it important



Provides a basis for maximizing the cost-efficiency of infrastructure-dependent services



Enables fact-based decisions regarding a best value approach for providing services



Helps understand and compare servicing alternatives, even when they may have markedly different initial capital costs and annual operation and maintenance costs



Provides consistency and transparency in decision processes




Costs to consider

- Design & construction for infrastructure
- Purchase cost & shipping for other assets
- Operation, maintenance, utilities
- Program costs
 - Art supplies, sports equipment, ice making, water plant chemicals
- Staff costs
 - Lifeguard, truck driver
- Midlife retrofit for infrastructure
- Repairs or upgrades
- End-of-life disposal costs, or resale value
 - Environmental fees for vehicle disposal
 - Resale value of equipment
 - Building deconstruction



Example 1 – Rec Complex






Example 2 – Road surfacing

Asset life	60 years		
Base road cost	\$ 1,000,000 per km		
Surface type	Gravel Road with dust suppression (Polymer) (2 years)	Chipseal (5 years + extra layer at construction)	Pavement (20 years)
Resurfacing interval	2	5	20
Number of surfacings	30	13	3
Cost to resurface 1 km	\$ 10,000	\$ 100,000	\$ 315,000
Total for resurfacing	\$ 300,000	\$ 1,300,000	\$ 945,000
Total cost per km over lifetime	\$ 1,300,000	\$ 2,300,000	\$ 1,945,000

Make Informed and Transparent Decisions

Know the cost of the decisions you are making.

Inform residents of these costs so they can understand the decisions of Council.
